

IMMUNIZATION CLINIC FOR CHILDREN

The Rush County Health Department provides immunizations for children on first Thursday of each month, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in Room #105, Courthouse.

Immunizations available are Diphtheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Polio, Hib, Hepatitis B, Varicella (Chickenpox), Prevnar, Rotovirus, HPV (Gardasil), and Meningococcal (Menactra). These are provided free of charge from the Indiana State Department of Health to children through the age of eighteen.

Children under eighteen are required to have a parent or guardian fill out and sign permission forms each time the child receives an immunization. Records of previous immunizations should be brought in with the child.

Federal guidelines states if a child has insurance coverage, other than Medicaid, you will need to contact the insurance carrier to see if the insurance covers vaccines. If it does, you will need to contact your doctor and have the child receive his/her vaccine from the doctor. Even if you have a deductible or co-pay, you must get the vaccine from the doctor.

To be eligible to receive the immunizations at the Rush County Health Department, you must be on Medicaid, OR be uninsured, OR be underinsured which means that the insurance does not cover vaccines or a particular vaccine *Any questions may be directed to the Rush County Health Department 765-932-3103*
